

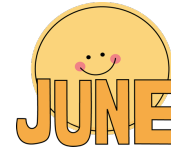

Word Analysis Lessons 1-5: Endings -ed, -ing, -s; Lessons 6-10: Suffixes -ly, -ian, -ize; Lessons 11-15: Prefixes com-, epi-, pro-; Lessons 16-18: Idioms Conventions Nouns; Pronouns; Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement; Verbs; Verb Phrases

Science The class will be learning about plant life and will be planting their own terrarium.
